

## ATTENTION ALL RN's and LPN's

Please be sure that you have read and understand the information below regarding licensure. Failure to comply will result in being removed from the schedule and may result in termination of employment.

- You must be licensed in the state where you live. (For example, if you live in Delaware, then you must have a DE nurse's license.)
- You have only thirty days to obtain your Maryland license once you have moved to the state. (For example, if you have an active license in the state of Florida when you are hired, once you relocate to the state of Maryland you must obtain a Maryland license within 30 days.)
- If you are a nurse who has a compact license, and you are moving to Maryland, you must apply for a license by endorsement. You can work on your compact state license for thirty days.

TO RENEW AND MAINTAIN LICENSURE.**
