Signs of a Stroke

- Sudden numbness, tingling, weakness or paralysis involving face, trunk, arm or leg on one side of the body
- Sudden garbled speech or inability of speak or understand
- Sudden loss of vision in one eye or to one side of your field of view
- Loss of balance which persists and is not provoked by head movement
- Sudden severe headache

If you or someone you know exhibits one or more of these signs, call 911 or go to the nearest emergency room immediately.
