The resident will also perform other clinical pharmacist activities, including participation in the formal consultation service and on-call coverage. Upon completion, the resident will be prepared to function as a clinical pharmacist in a hospital setting, continue advanced training through a PGY-2 residency, or apply for a faculty appointment.
